Visionary Modern: Raymond Jonson Trilogies, Cycles, and Portraits

August 31 to November 24, 2021 UNM Art Museum's Main Gallery Curated by Mary Statzer, PhD.

It is with great enthusiasm that we announce the reopening of the UNM Art Museum on August 31st, 2021. After an 18-month closure due to the pandemic, it is an honor to bring art and people together again.

This Fall, we invite you to view *Visionary Modern: Raymond Jonson Trilogies, Cycles, and Portraits*, an exhibition surveying the long career of Raymond Jonson (1891-1982), one of New Mexico's leading abstract painters of the twentieth century and a former educator at the University of New Mexico.

The exhibition will be on display in the UNM Art Museum's Main Gallery from August 31 to November 24, 2021.

Visionary Modern contains fourteen trilogies and cycles, each containing three paintings, that were made between 1918-1973. Jonson embraced the notion that the sum is greater than its parts, creating multi-canvas works because he believed a single painting could not represent vast subjects like the Grand Canyon. He also used trilogies and cycles to express the depth of feeling he experienced while exploring and living in the Western landscape.

Visionary Modern traces Jonson's transformation as a painter of recognizable subjects to a master of non-objective abstraction. His subject matter evolved from dramatic portraits of people in his life to the depiction of his spiritual concerns, time, rhythm, balance, and energy. Jonson's paintings celebrate the potential of abstract art to communicate both deep emotions and conceptual themes.

Raymond Jonson's legacy at the University of New Mexico is threefold: as an educator, a curator, and a living modernist mentor around which a strong community of artists was built in Albuquerque. His contributions to the University community include more than 600 paintings, drawings, and prints donated to the UNM Art Museum, making it the world's largest repository of Jonson's work. In an effort to continue this legacy, the UNM Art Museum is launching the Raymond Jonson Web Portal. This online resource documents Jonson's life and career and is richly illustrated with personal snapshots, journal entries, and images of his artwork. We invite you to explore the Raymond Jonson Web Portal, launching on August 31 at artmuseum.unm.edu
